The following areas represent those parts of the contract that require the Offeror to complete:

- B.1 Phase-in (Firm Fixed Price)
- B.5 Rate Table for Pricing Task Orders
- G.5 Submission of Vouchers for Payment
- H.4 Key Personnel and Facilities
- H.9 Representations, Certifications, and Other Statements of Offerors

(b) Representations, Certifications, and Other Statements of Offerors

Offerors shall submit their completed Representations and Certifications (all of Section K). This material is to be provided as part of the model contract.
