Line 11, on Page 51 further reads "Minimum certification requirements are also addressed in Appendix M((1)(1)(c-i). Problems arise when comparing the above statement "compliance with all applicable technical certifications and qualifications of the Office of the State Fire Marshal (of California)..." and the training requirements outlined in Appendix M. This is because the Requirements and Standards outlined in Appendix M are broken down into fire fighter certifications/qualifications as identified by the National Fire Protection Agency (NFPA), and not by the California State Fire Marshal. The California State Fire Marshal fire fighter training/certification/qualification system differs completely from the NFPA training/certification/qualification system. The State of California has not adopted the standards for training/certification/qualification outlined by the NFPA, and instead offers its own version of standards/certifications/qualifications. For example, the Office of the State Fire Marshal of California does not offer certification/qualification as a Fire Officer II, Apparatus Driver Operator Pumper or Aerial, Airport Fire Fighter, etc., instead they offer Fire Officer Certification, Chief Officer Certification, Driver/Operator Certification, etc.	Question 19: Do all incumbent fire department personnel possess the required certifications listed in the RFP in both Attachment J.1(a) 1 and Appendix M and N?
