Human Health and Institutional Management Support (HHIMS) Contract


On March 5, 2013, I met with members of the Procurement Team (PT) appointed to evaluate the proposals for an Indefinite-Delivery, Indefinite-Quantity (IDIQ) Contract with Firm-Fixed Price (FFP) task orders and a FFP phase-in period for the Human Health and Institutional Management Support (HHIMS) Contract, Solicitation NNJ132BH003R. As stated in the RFP, award will be made to the responsible offeror with the lowest price technically acceptable proposal, which meets the eligibility considerations and has an acceptable model contract.

In response to the HHIMS RFP, eight offerors submitted proposals for the HHIMS procurement. The companies who provided proposals are: 1) Ian, Evan, & Alexander Corporation (IEA); 2) Aerodyne Industries, LLC; 3) Polaris Technology Solutions; 4) All Points Logistics; 5) DataVise Information Technology Services, Inc.; 6) TISTA Science and Technology Corporation; 7) Skylla Engineering Ltd.; and 8) ePro LLC. Of the eight proposals, four were determined to be Technically Acceptable (IEA, Polaris, All Points Logistics, and ePro). The remaining four (Aerodyne, DataVise, TISTA, and Skylla) were determined to be Technically Unacceptable. The evaluated prices proposed in all proposals are as follows:

Source Selection Decision

With respect to the HHIMS contract, my decision was based on selecting the proposal offering the lowest price technically acceptable approach consistent with the RFP's stated criteria for award. I reviewed the PT evaluation, questioned the basis for the PT findings presented to me, and received the opinions of the advisors present. After considering all of the information presented to me, I find that All Points Logistics provided the lowest priced technically acceptable proposal. I therefore select All Points Logistics for award.
