

RESPONSES TO QUESTIONS TO NNG1450002P

Q.1. We are EM385 and OSHA 30 trained. Is there an additional safety requirement?

A.1. The safety requirements are listed by reference in the solicitation as Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) Clause 52.236-13 Accident Prevention, Alternate I, and NASA FAR Supplement (NFS) Clauses 1852.223-72 Safety and Health (Short Form), and 1852.223-75 Major Breach of Safety or Security. Q.2. After reviewing the responses issued on 5/05/14, what is the small business set aside? I am wondering if we will be able to bid this job? What are the limitations?

A.2. The Small Business Administration (SBA) defines a small business concern as one that is independently owned and operated, is organized for profit, and is not dominant in its field. Depending on the industry, size standard eligibility is based on the average number of employees for the preceding twelve months or on sales volume averaged over a three-year period. This particular acquisition is 100% set-aside for small business concerns, under the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) Code Number 238220, Plumbing, Heating, and Air-Conditioning Contractors. The size standard for this NAICS Code is \$14.0 million. Block 10 of the Standard Form (SF) 1449 shows this information.
