The National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA), Lyndon B. Johnson Space Center (JSC), is pleased to release the RFP, number NNJ14507542R, for the ISS Commercial Resupply Services 2 (CRS2) acquisition. This replaces the Draft RFP issued on June 16, 2014, in its entirety. The RFP is a solicitation.

NASA has incorporated key aspects of industry feedback on the overall CRS2 procurement strategy through the Request for Information issued in February 2014, Industry Day in April 2014, the Pre-Solicitation Conference in August 2014, and written questions and comments from industry. Some of the updates to the RFP from the industry input are outlined below.

- Defined annual requirement of 15,000 Kg of pressurized upmass for pricing evaluation
- Defined annual requirement of 2,000 Kg of unpressurized upmass for pricing evaluation
- Included the Deviated version of the Cross-Waiver of Liability for Space Station Activities
- Revision of Capability list items in Mission Capabilities for the Standard Resupply Service Mission Table
- Clarification in mission success criteria and precedence of clauses in a mission failure
- Updated proposal page counts and formats

The Government intends to award task orders to meet the minimum order quantity concurrent with award of the basic contract(s). The Government reserves the right to issue the task order(s) after the award of the basic contract(s).

Questions Related to the RFP:

All questions or comments must be submitted in writing by October 17, 2014, to the Contracting Officer listed below, and shall not be marked as confidential, proprietary, competition sensitive, business information, etc. No questions of any nature or form shall be directed to any NASA technical personnel. Responses to questions will be provided in the form of an amendment to the RFP.
