

NASA/GSFC plans to issue a Request for Proposal (RFP), Software Engineering Services II (SES II) for the Software Engineering Division (SED) in support of the Applied Engineering and Technology Directorate (AETD).

The needed services are SED services and support the engineering of software and information systems through all phases (formulation through on-orbit operations/decommissioning) of NASA programs and projects. These systems include: flight, ground, and science data software for spacecraft monitoring, control, on-orbit performance management and operations; spacecraft data processing and analysis; information management; and science data analysis and management. The SED focuses on the development of reusable flight and ground architectures and frameworks to reduce mission cost, decrease development time, minimize customer risk, and increase the scientific value of information products. The SED provides expertise in software systems engineering, secure environments, and the software product development lifecycle to ensure the delivery of reliable software and information systems solutions.

The Government anticipates a release date for the Request for Proposal (RFP) in December, 2014 with an anticipated offer due date in January, 2015.

The Government does not intend to acquire a commercial item using FAR Part 12.

This procurement will be a total 8 (a) set-aside.

The NAICS Code Size Standards are 541712 and 1000 employees, respectively.

The contract type is anticipated to be a single award, Cost Plus Fixed Fee (CPFF), Core contract with an IDIQ portion. The IDIQ portion of the contract is anticipated to have a maximum ordering value of \$246M.

All responsible sources may submit an offer when applicable, which shall be considered by the agency.

NOTES:

The anticipated posting date of the Draft Request for Proposal (DRFP) is September, 2014. This will be an opportunity for potential offerors to provide questions, comments or any concerns regarding the DRFP and attachments which includes the Statement of Work (SOW). No proposal/offer is to be submitted during this posting which will end in October, 2014.

The Prime contractor must have a Top Secret Clearance at time of proposal, meaning your company's facility clearance license (FCL) must be registered with the Defense Security Services (DSS). Joint Ventures should check with DSS to make sure that their FCL is handled properly.
