We respectfully request that Offerors be allowed to alter the formatting and layout of Attachment L-H to better utilize the space allocation, as long as all of the data fields are included. Also, we request that Attachment L-H be included in Table L-20.2 as an exception to the 12 point Times New Roman font requirement. Start with the present position or most recent position. Continue in reverse chronological order with separate pages to show changes in employment, significant changes in job descriptions and/or duties, and periods of unemployment. Supervisor and customer references will be contacted during the proposal evaluation. Do not submit work experience for time periods beyond ten (10) years from the proposal due date specified in the solicitation.
